RE: WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT OPERATIONS

Treatment Plant-

Operations at the plant are very challenging. This is the cause of the amount of biosolids in the biosolids basin, along with the fact our biosolids contractor is running extremely late due to the wet spring.

With the amount of biosolids and the fact we have a filamentous bacteri in the basin which causes the solids not to settle is causing the operational challenge in the aeration basin.

This condition has forced me to waste biosolids into the polishing pond. I have made the decision to waste to the polishing pond in an attempt to keep (the most important part of the treatment) the aeration basin operating. Due to the amount of solids we are forced to hold in the aeration basin has caused us to add polymer which is a settling agent.

I spoke with our Biosolids contractor and he has pushed our hauling back to the first of September.

Kennedy Industries has completed the installation of our new SCADA system. The guys and I say "Thank You for this much needed up grade."

Our blowers are being built. I hope to see the installation of these new units sometime in November. I will be working to find buyers for our old blowers.

I will be attending The 2019 Agro Expo Tuesday August 13th and 14th.

Although it is an Ag Expo the Department of Great Lakes Environment and Energy along with Michigan Rural Water Association take this opportunity to show how corn production is as good or better when Biosolids is applied compared to conventional fertilizer.

Lift Stations-

New SCADA has been installed in 7 of the 8 liftstaions. We can monitor all 7 staion via computer or phone. When an alarm is trigged a call tree will begin.

Regulatory-

All monthly and quarterly reports are submitted.
